Farm Accidents can be preventedwith your help

No accident-prevention program can be successful without the wholehearted co-operation of the person who is directly responsible for the operation of equipment.

It is true that the designer, the manufacturer, the safety engineer can help; and they will help, but their combined efforts can be wiped out by a single careless act of the operator.

It is said that "the best kind of a safety device is a careful operator." We ask you to be that kind of an operator.


INSTRUCTIONS FOR OPERATING

Do not throw the spreader in year while the machine is in motion.

CHAINS

Run all chains with hooks forward and slot side out, except the apron chains, which should be run as shown in Illust. 23.

To detach chain, bend to bend to coupling position, and strike light blows.



HOW TO LOAD

CAUTION! In freezing weather, make sure that the apron is not frozen to the bed. Before loading, always be sure that the feed lever on the right side of the spreader is in neutral.

In order to get the best results, both as to spreading manure evenly on the ground and to avoid heavy draft, the machine should be loaded at the forward end of the box first, and continue loading toward the rear end until the cylinder is reached, being careful not to force the manure against the cylinder. This will allow the cylinder to start easy and the machine will draw much easier when loaded in this manner, as the manure is more easily separated.

When ready to spread, stop the tractor, and put the drive chain in gear by moving the left lever to the lower notch in the sector. Then set the feed lever (on right side) in Notch 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 for the desired amount to spread.

When the load is almost all spread, a little manure will remain in the bed. To clean this out, disengage the drive and shift the lever into high feed. When the machine is empty, disengage the feed. Make this a regular practice so the feed will always be disengaged when the machine is empty.

GOOD CARE - LUBRICATION

Good care of a machine will save a great deal of expense and time. The manure spreader, above all other machines used on the farm, is subject to the worst conditions. Spreaders are often left in the field or yard, exposed to all conditions of weather, without attempting to clean or lubricate them properly. A machine should be stored in the shed or barn, and before storing away should be well cleaned and lubricated. A little kerosene is good occasionally on the apron links and the main bearings of the machine, afterwards using a little heavy lubricant, as the lye and acids which come from the manure are very severe on the metal parts, causing the steel to rust. Always use plenty of lubricant. It will increase the life of your machine. Before using, lubricate all parts well, such as the main axle bearings, cylinder bearings, apron drive shaft and widespread spiral boxes, and also see that all joints on the chain are well lubricated. This will make the apron run easier and prevent the links from rusting.
