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
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Introduction

Read this manual carefully to learn how to operate and maintain your product properly. The information in this manual can help you and others avoid injury and product damage. Although New Holland designs and produces safe products, you are responsible for operating the product properly and safely.

Whenever you need service, genuine New Holland parts, or additional information, contact an Authorized Service Dealer or New Holland Customer Service and have the model and serial numbers of your product ready. Figure 1 illustrates the location of the model and serial numbers on the product.

This manual identifies potential hazards and has special safety messages that help you and others avoid personal injury and even death. *Danger*, *Warning*, and *Caution* are signal words used to identify the level of hazard. However, regardless of the hazard, be extremely careful.

Safety decals and instructions are easily visible to the operator and are located near any area of potential danger. Replace any decal that is damaged or lost.



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


An uncovered discharge opening could allow the lawn mower to throw objects in the operator's or bystander's direction and result in serious injury. Also, contact with the blade could occur.

- *Never* remove the grass deflector from the mower because the grass deflector routes material down toward the turf. If the grass deflector is ever damaged, replace it immediately.
- *Never* put your hands or feet under the mower.
- *Never* try to clear discharge area or mower blades unless you move the power take off (PTO) to *Off* and rotate the ignition key to *Off*. Also remove the key and pull the wire off the spark plug(s).

Installing the Grass Deflector on 42 and 48 inch Side Discharge Mowers

- 1. Locate items shown in Figure 2.
- **2.** Place the straight end of the spring into the small hole in the discharge chute (Fig. 2).
- **3.** Position the spring and discharge chute over post on rear of deck and secure with a washer (1/2 inch) and a cotter pin (3/4 inch) (Fig. 2).
- **4.** Slide the rubber bushing and plastic washer over the stud at the front of mower.
- **5.** Place the discharge chute over the stud and secure it with a plastic washer and jam nut (3/8 inch) (Fig. 2).

Important Grass deflector must be spring loaded in the down position. Lift deflector up to test that it snaps to the full down position.




- Cotter pin, 3/4 inch 3

Installing the Grass Deflector on 52 inch Mowers

- 1. Place the springs into the brackets on mower with the hooked ends over the raised back (Fig. 3).
- 2. Align the grass deflector with the holes in the brackets and the spring straight end in the space under the hinge and above the deflector (Fig. 3).
- 3. Secure the deflector to the bracket with 2 bolts (3/8 x 3-1/2 inch) and 2 locknuts (3/8 inch) (Fig. 3).
- 4. Lift grass deflector and check that it is spring loaded and pivots freely to the full down position.

Important Grass deflector must be spring loaded in the down position. Lift the deflector up to test that it snaps down to the full down position.





Installing the Mower

- 1. Disengage the PTO and set the parking brake.
- 2. Stop the engine, remove the key, and wait for all moving parts to stop before leaving the operating position.
- 3. Position the mower on the right side of the tractor.
- 4. Turn the front wheels fully to the left and raise attachment lift lever or electric lift all the way up. Refer to the tractor Operator's Manual.
- 5. Open the mid-mount hitch by pulling out the J-pin and moving the lock handle rearward (Fig. 4).



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
