

Understanding The Machine Safety Labels




Safety-Alert Symbol

The machine safety labels shown in this section are placed in important areas on your machine to draw attention to potential safety hazards.

On your machine safety labels, the words DANGER, WARNING, and CAUTION are used with this safety-alert symbol. DANGER identifies the most serious hazards.


The operator's manual also explains any potential safety hazards whenever necessary in special safety messages that are identified with the word, CAUTION, and the safety-alert symbol.

- Service per operator's manual.


WARNING - Rotating Cutter


WARNING - Flying Object Hazard


Danger - Pinch Area



Keep clear during operation.



Operator Training Required



- Study the Skid Steer's Operator Manual. Know the location and function of all controls. Know how to operate the skid steer before using this attachment.
- Study operating section of this manual before operating a broom attachment. Know location and function of all controls.
- Operate machine in an open, unobstructed area under the direction of an experienced operator.
- Eye protection should be worn when operating the cold planer without a demolition door or cab enclosure.
- Operator experience is required to learn the moving, stopping, turning, and other operating characteristics of the machine.
- Learn the use of all controls.

Operate Safely

• Inspect the machine and attachment before you operate. Be sure all hardware is tight. Repair or replace damaged, badly worn, or missing parts. Be sure guards

and shields are in good condition and fastened in place. Make any necessary adjustments before you operate.

- Clear work area of objects that might be thrown. Keep people and pets out of the work area. Stop machine if anyone enters the area.
- Do not operate cold planer unless it is properly installed on the skid steer.
- If you hit an object, stop the machine and inspect machine for damage. Make repairs before you operate again. Keep machine properly maintained and in good working order.
- Do not leave machine unattended while it is running.
- Operate only during daylight or with adequate artificial light.
- Watch for overhead wires. Never touch wires with any part of the skid steer boom or attachment.
- · Do not let anyone ride on the skid steer.
- Do not let children or an untrained person operate machine.
- Always check to the sides and rear of the skid steer before backing up.

Park Safely


- 1. Stop machine on a level surface, not on a slope.
- 2. Lower boom so attachment is on the ground. (If you must leave boom raised, be sure any attachment is removed and the boom locks are in the locked [Engaged] position, and boom is resting on locks.)
- 3. Engage park brake switch.
- 4. Stop engine and release seat belt.
- 5. Remove key.
- 6. Before you leave the operator's seat, wait for engine and all moving parts to stop.

Avoid Tipping

- · Do not drive where machine could slip or tip.
- Stay alert for holes and other hidden hazards in the terrain. Avoid rocks, roots and ditches.
- Slow down before you make a sharp turn or operate on a slope.
- Drive up and down a hill not across. Be careful when you change direction on a slope.
- If skid steer begins tipping forward with boom raised, immediately lower boom to regain stability.

SAFETY

Wear Appropriate Clothing



MIF

- Wear close fitting clothing and safety equipment appropriate for the job.
- Always wear safety goggles or safety glasses with side shields when operating the machine.
- Wear a suitable protective device such as earplugs. Loud noise can cause impairment or loss of hearing.
- Do not wear radio or music headphones. Safe service and operation requires your full attention.

Stay Clear of Rotating Devices



MIF

Entanglement in rotating devices can cause serious injury or death.

• Stop the engine and be sure attachment is stopped before exiting the skid steer and before allowing people near the attachment.

Practice Safe Maintenance

• Do not work under a raised boom unless it is resting on boom locks and attachment has been removed. When lowered, boom arms will move near engine hood and frame; never stand or lean on skid steer where linkage can crush you.



MIF

- Understand service procedure before doing work. Keep area clean and dry.
- Never lubricate, service, or adjust machine while it is moving. Keep safety devices in place and in working condition. Keep hardware tight.
- Keep hands, feet, clothing, jewelry, and long hair away from any moving parts, to prevent them from getting caught.
- Lower attachment to the ground before servicing machine. Disengage all power and stop the engine. Engage park brake and remove the key. Let machine cool.
- Before servicing the machine, carefully release pressure from any components with stored energy, such as hydraulic components.
- · Keep all nuts and bolts tightened.
- Securely support any machine elements that must be raised for service work.
- Never run engine unless park brake is locked.
