



Safety

Operate Safely

DO NOT operate cultivator without reading this operator's manual.

DO NOT allow anyone to ride on the cultivator when it is in motion. Observe operation only from the tractor platform.

Always shut off tractor engine and shift to "Park" when leaving tractor. Remove key when leaving tractor unattended.

DO NOT operate close to a ditch or creek.


Slow down when turning.

Drive slowly over rough ground.

Apply both tractor brakes evenly when making emergency stops. Plan ahead.

Wear relatively tight and belted clothing to prevent being caught on some part of the machine.

Protect Against Noise



A-Earmuffs B-Ear Plugs

Prolonged exposure to loud noise can cause impairment or loss of hearing.

Wear a suitable hearing protective device such as earmuffs (A) or earplugs (B) to protect against objectionable or uncomfortable loud noises.

Avoid Fires

DO NOT refuel with the tractor engine running.

DO NOT smoke or use a fantern when refueling.

Transport Safely

DO NOT fail to latch the tractor brakes together.

Shift the tractor into a lower gear when transporting down steep slopes or hills.

Keep the tractor SMV emblem clean and visible from the rear.

Stop slowly.

When transporting the cultivator on a road or highway at night or during the day, use accessory lights and devices for adequate warning to operators of other vehicles. In this regard, check local governmental regulations. Various safety lights and devices are available from your John Deere dealer.


Practice Safe Maintenance

DO NOT lubricate, adjust, or clean the cultivator while it is in motion.

Always use a safety support when working on, under, or around the cultivator.

Shut off engine and remove key when working on cultivator.

When mounting a tire on a wheel or rim, failure to follow proper procedure can produce an explosion which can result in serious injury or death. Do not attempt to mount a tire unless you have the proper equipment and experience to perform the job. Have it done by your John Deere dealer or a qualified tire repair service.



A-Pin Hole Leak

Escaping fluid under pressure can have sufficient force to penetrate the skin, causing serious personal injury. Before disconnecting lines, be sure to relieve all pressure. Before applying pressure to the system, be sure all connections are tight and that lines, pipe, and hoses are not damaged.


Fluid escaping from a very small hole can be almost invisible. Use a piece of cardboard or wood, rather than hands, to search for suspected leaks.

If injured by escaping fluid, see a doctor at once. Serious infection or reaction can develop if proper medical treatment is not administered immediately.

Tractor with Category 2 Three-Point Hitch

Wheel Spacing

Set the tractor wheels for the desired row spacing so the wheels are centered between the rows. The dimension "A" from the center of the tractor to the center of each tire should be the same.

On tractor with adjustable-tread front axle, set the front wheel tread 8 inches (203 mm) narrower than twice the row width to be cultivated (68-inch [1 727 mm] tread for 38-inch [965 mm] row spacing.)

See your tractor operator's manual for correct tire inflation pressures.

Sway Blocks

Place the sway blocks (B) in the category 2 down position for use with rear rigs. See your tractor operator's manual.

Drawbar Position

Place drawbar (C) as far forward as possible. Pin drawbar in a fixed, centered position.
