This manual should be considered a permanent part of your machine and should remain with the machine when you sell it.


Measurements in this manual are U.S. customary units and their metric equivalents.


Right-hand and left-hand sides are determined by facing in the direction of forward travel.








INSPECT WAGON GEAR

Check condition of tires and wheel rims.


Keep wheel bolts tightened to 176 N·m (130 lb-ft) torque on 700 and 720 Wagons and 230 N·m (170 lb-ft) on 740 Wagons.
