OPERATE SAFELY

- · Keep all curtains and shields in place.
- · Never hand feed material into the machine.
- Do not lean against or sit or stand on the cutterbar curtains or their supporting framework.
- Do not operate mower-conditioner with cutterbar in raised position.
- Regularly check that disk and knife bolts are tight; also verify that tines are securely mounted on rotor.
- Always operate the machine at rated speed.
- Drive slowly over rough ground.
- Provide sufficient weight to stabilize the tractor when operating on hilly land or other adverse conditions. See your tractor operator's manual.

AVOID INJURY FROM THROWN OBJECTS

Extreme care must be exercised to avoid injury from thrown objects. Do not, under any circumstances, operate the mower-conditioner when other people are in the vicinity. Stones and other objects can be thrown great distances by the rotating cutting blades.

The cutterbar curtains are very important to reduce the potential for thrown objects. Always keep these curtains down when operating the mower-conditioner. Replace the curtains if they should become worn or damaged.

For additional operator protection from thrown objects, it is requested that the mower-conditioner be used only with tractors having an operator enclosure.



USE SAFETY LIGHTS AND DEVICES

Prevent collisions between other road users, slow moving tractors with attachments or towed equipment, and self-propelled machines on public roads. Frequently check for traffic from the rear, especially in turns, and use hand signals or turn signal lights.

Use headlights, flashing warning lights, and turn signals day and night. Follow local regulations for equipment lighting and marking. Keep lighting and marking visible and in good working order. Replace or repair lighting and marking that has been damaged or lost. An implement safety lighting kit is available from your John Deere dealer.
