

Advise customer that life expectancy of this machine like any other machine, is dependent upon regular lubrication as described in the operator's manual.  Give operator's manual to the customer and explain all operating adjustments and lubrication fully.  Explain proper hookup of hydraulic cylinder advising that hydraulic hoses must be 9-1/2 ft (2.90 m) long.	Advise customer of the optional attachments that are available for special crop and operating conditions.  When mower is transported on a road or highway at night or during the day, accessory lights and devices should be used for adequate warning to operators of other vehicles. Various safety lights and devices are available from your John Deere dealer. In this regard, tell the customer to check local governmental regulations.  (Signature)




#### **FOLLOW SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **PROTECT BYSTANDERS**

Stand clear of mower at all times when machine is operating and when raising and lowering cutterbar.

Do not allow children to operate tractor or mower.



#### **OPERATE MOWER SAFELY**

Check hardware, condition of hydraulic hoses and connections, and machine condition before operating.

All safety shields must be in place.


Slow down on hillsides and curves to minimize the danger of tipping. Do not mow near the edge of a ditch or gully.

#### **KEEP RIDERS OFF MACHINE**

Only allow the operator on the machine. Keep riders off.

Riders on machine are subject to injury such as being struck by foreign objects and being thrown off of the machine. Riders also obstruct the operator's view resulting in the machine being operated in an unsafe manner.



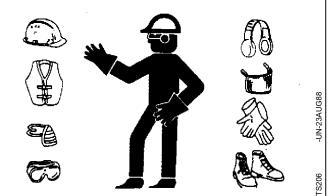
#### WEAR PROTECTIVE CLOTHING


#### HANDLE CHEMICAL PRODUCTS SAFELY

#### STAY CLEAR OF ROTATING DRIVELINES

Entanglement in rotating driveline can cause serious injury or death.

Keep tractor master shield and driveline shields in place at all times. Make sure rotating shields turn freely.

Wear close fitting clothing. Stop the engine and be sure PTO driveline is stopped before making adjustments, connections, or cleaning out PTO driven equipment.



#### **USE SAFETY LIGHTS AND DEVICES**

Slow moving tractors, self-propelled equipment and towed implements or attachments can create a hazard when driven on public roads. They are difficult to see, especially at night. Avoid personal injury or death resulting from collision with a vehicle.

Whenever driving on public roads, use flashing warning lights and turn signal according to local regulation. To increase visibility, use the lights and devices provided with your machine. For some equipment, install extra flashing warning lights.

Keep safety items in good condition. Replace missing or damaged items. An implement safety lighting kit is available from your John Deere dealer.



#### **USE A SAFETY CHAIN**

A safety chain will help control drawn equipment should it accidentally separate from the drawbar.

Using the appropriate adapter parts, attach the chain to the tractor drawbar support or other specified anchor location. Provide only enough slack in the chain to permit turning.

See your John Deere dealer for a chain with a strength rating equal to or greater than the gross weight of the towed machine. Do not use safety chain for towing.
