The warranty does not cover:


A—Products which have been altered or modified in ways not approved by John Deere, including setting fuel delivery above specifications or otherwise overpowering of products.



TRANSPORTER SAFETY SIGNS



A WARNING

HELP PREVENT INJURY OR DEATH FROM MACHINE OVERTURN

- Reduce load when operating over rough or hilly terrain.
- 2. Reduce speed when turning or when operating around obstacles, on rough ground, or on slopes.
- 3. Use of a helmet is recommended when operating in rough terrain.

- 1. Read Operators Manual before operating vehicle.

- 3. This machine intended for off road use only.
- 4. Keep loadgard and all shields in place.
- 5. Inflate tires to 5 PSI (35 kPa). Overinflation or underinflation could adversely affect control of machine.
- 6. The maximum pay load capacity is 600 lb. (272 kg).
- 7. Securely anchor all loads.
- Stop engine before refueling.
- Stop engine, set parking brake, and shift to neutral before dismounting.
- Remove key if leaving vehicle unattended.






PROTECT CHILDREN
