

RECOGNIZE SAFETY INFORMATION

UNDERSTAND SIGNAL WORDS

A signal word—DANGER, WARNING, or CAUTION—is used with the safety-alert symbol. DANGER identifies the most serious hazards.



DO NOT MODIFY MACHINE

Do not make any unauthorized modifications to the machine in any way.

Modifications can result in making the machine unstable, increasing the possibility of roll-over causing severe bodily injury or death.



INSPECT TRANSPORTER

Inspect mechanical condition of your transporter before each use to minimize chance of injury or being stranded. Remember, you can ride farther in an hour than you can walk in a day.

Keep all shields in place. Be sure to check condition of tires and wheels, and maintain proper tire pressure.




PROTECT CHILDREN

NEVER carry children in cargo area. DO NOT let children ride on transporter or any attachment.

Keep children and others away when you operate machine.

Before you back up or turn, look behind and around transporter for children.

ADULT OPERATORS ONLY

The transporter is NOT a toy.

Young drivers may not have the strength or experience to control the transporter. This increases their chances of roll-over resulting in severe bodily injury or death.

The transporter should not be operated by anyone under the age of 16 years.

OPERATE TRANSPORTER SAFELY

DO NOT misuse the AMT, it is a utility hauler NOT a recreational vehicle.

Horseplay and recreational riding can lead to accidents, severe bodily injury or death.

Sit on center of seat and keep both feet within foot platform perimeter. Never operate transporter while standing.

Always use both hands for steering.

Use existing trails. Avoid terrain where you do not belong, such as dangerous slopes, impassable swamps and low hanging branches.


Before dismounting: —Come to complete stop.

- -Stop engine.
- -Shift to neutral.
- -Set parking brake.
- -Remove key.

USE HAND HOLDS

A hand hold (A) is provided for passenger balance when driving over rough terrain. Side rails on seats may also be used.

PREVENT MACHINE RUNAWAY

Avoid possible injury or death from machine runaway.

Do not start engine by shorting across starter terminals. Machine will start in gear if normal circuitry is by passed.

NEVER start engine while standing on ground. Start engine only from operator's seat, with transaxle in neutral, with park brake engaged.



INFLATE TIRES PROPERLY

Keep tires inflated to 34-41 kPa (5-6 psi).

Improper tire inflation can affect stability and control of machine.

DO NOT mix sizes of tires. Use of John Deere approved original or optional equipment is recommended. Turf, Bar, and Knobby tires are available.

Order replacement or optional tires from your John Deere dealer.

Use of a helmet is recommended when operating in rough terrain.

When descending a hill, remove foot from accelerator and apply brakes to reduce speed and maintain control.

Be alert. Transporter will free wheel downhill. Due to belt drive, there is no engine braking effect.

Reduce speed and exercise extreme caution on slopes or on rough ground.

Drive very slowly when turning, sharp turns can cause the transporter to roll-over even at slower speeds or on flat ground.


Horseplay and recreational riding can lead to accidents, severe bodily injury or death.

Keep front wheel straight at crest of hill, going over bumps, or at any time front wheel is off ground.

Do not stop or start suddenly when going uphill or downhill. Be especially cautious when changing direction on slopes.

Stay alert for holes, rocks, and roots in the terrain, and other hidden hazards. Keep away from drop-offs.


TRANSPORT LOADS SAFELY


Use care when towing loads:

- -Use only approved hitch point.
- —Do not tow loads that exceed 455kg (1000 lb). Ten percent of towed weight should rest on drawbar.

When carrying loads:

- -Be sure load guard is properly installed.
- -Be sure load is evenly dispersed.
- -Do not load above load guard.
- —Do not exceed maximum box payload capacity of 272 kg (600 lb) on level terrain.
- -Reduce box payload when operating on rough or hilly terrain.
- -Securely anchor all loads.





WORK IN VENTILATED AREA

Engine exhaust fumes can cause sickness or death. If it is necessary to run an engine in an enclosed area, remove the exhaust fumes from the area with an exhaust pipe extension.

If you do not have an exhaust pipe extension, open the doors and get outside air into the area.
